God interrupts our busyness

As we prepared for an outreach of The Father's Heart recently a hungry woman walked into the driveway. My first impulse was to tell her to come back at 11 a.m. when the outreach began. But she said she was hungry and asked if she could have a little something before then.

SHE PICKED out some yogurt and started to walk away, and then came back. "I was attacked by two pit bulls," she said. "I didn't believe in God before, but I sure do now."

She told us how some strangers helped her fend off the dogs and called 911 and get the medical help she needed. "Most people don't survive one pit bull attack," she said. "I survived two at the same time, by the grace of God."

SHE SAID she had 90 stitches in her head and other parts of her body. As I stood there and listened, she poured out her heart about how her daughter died, she was one year clean from her drug and alcohol addictions, and now she knows that God sustained her and saved her from her sins, and the pit bulls.

She was a lonely woman who was hungry, all alone and isolated even more by the pandemic that has all of us isolated. She was so blessed to just talk to another real live person.

GOD INTERRUPTED our busyness, even in ministry, and gave us an awesome opportunity to pray with, and share the love and hope of Jesus, with His beautiful daughter! In our world, where so many are iso-

lated and afraid, our God is still working and reaching out to those who are scared, hungry, lonely and looking for the hope that can only be found in Christ Jesus.

LORD, HELP us to not get so caught up in our circumstances (good and not so good) that we miss the opportunities, and blessings, that You bring into our paths.

Part 39: Matthew 5:43-48 By a servant in Christ

God's love never fails

The story that follows took place eight years ago at the Liberty Pole in downtown Rochester. Although it appeared in a previous newsletter, its message and impact apply today more than ever. "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever" (Hebrews 13:8).

IT WAS a perfect night for sharing God's love. People had been blessed through the Word, prayer, captivating Christian hip-hop by brother Charles, and food. The crowd was beginning to thin, tracts and bread on the tables were almost gone. The evening had been uplifting, with the exception of an elderly woman "Doris," who had been difficult to deal with.

As usual, there were African-Americans and Hispanics in the outreach. Doris was angry to see Hispanics being fed and approached me saying: "They should all go back to Puerto Rico, Cuba or wherever the h--- they are from! We don't need no illegal wetbacks in this country!"

I TOLD her that if they were here legally, they were no different than her ancestors after they immigrated from Europe. Needless to say, she did not like my answer, shook her head, and walked away.

servants started packing up. One of the tables still had a few items and an African-American lady, "Emily," was quietly putting two loaves of bread in a bag we provided her. Doris noticed and started yelling vicious racial insults and obscenities.

"YOU DIRTY...! You are taking food away from deserving people! Parasite! Worse than that, you are a no good for nothin'!" As she yelled, her fingers pointed at Emily with anger and hostility. In doing so, she screamed the n-word at least four times. As this was going on, Emily quietly finished filling her bag.

I smelled trouble. Emily was younger, taller, and significantly outweighed Doris. I walked between them anticipating an altercation, and approached Doris, demanding her to either stop her rants or leave.

AS THE messy situation escalated, I looked backward and saw Emily slowly turn around. My concerns were becoming more real. As Emily approached Doris, I noticed some-

thing bizarre. Emily actually had a smile on her face. The sun had set and it was hard to see, but the smile did not appear sarcastic or contrived. It looked genuine.

I was confused. Did I miss something? What is going on here? Still not knowing Emily's intentions, I held my arms out as a referee in a boxing match.

AS EMILY approached Doris, she said with her loving smile: "I don't know you, but you and I have something in common..." Doris was irritated and with animated body language yelled: "YEAH, LIKE WHAT??" Calmly, Emily responded: "God loves you... and God loves me..."

Doris was not carrying any weapons but at that moment she seemed totally disarmed. She stood as if frozen with her shoulders down. In contrast, I was standing there speechless in awe.

EMILY SPOKE again to Doris: "And you know what else? I love you because Jesus loves you..." A few seconds later, Doris slowly turned around and walked away. Matthew 5:44 rattled around in my brain, but it was firmly rooted in Emily's heart. Although it has been eight years, I vividly remember my tingly goose bumps and watering eyes.

Choked up, I took a deep breath and said to Emily: "That was unbelievable. You have Jesus in your heart. It is a privilege to meet you and witness a blessed event that I will never forget." Emily then reached out to me for a loving hug.

AFTER INTRODUCTIONS, she asked me: "Do you know the lady's name?" I told her no. She then continued: "Tonight I will pray for her. She needs God's love in her life. It was nice meeting you. God bless." With that said, Emily disappeared into one of the side streets.

Driving home I reflected on this night, thanking Jesus for His impact on this broken world. The glory of God was clearly manifested that evening at the Liberty Pole.

MATTHEW 5:43-48: "Ye have heard that it hath been said, Thou shalt love thy neighbour, and hate thine enemy.
