As Christians we all have our hills and valleys, our moments of pure joy and anguish, peace and fear, belief and doubt, sickness and health.

Many times on ministry outreaches we are told of all these moments

in the lives of people with whom we come into contact. The servants of the Lord pray with them, cry out to the Lord with them, and share scripture with them to bring hope and give them the strength to go another day and to cling to the hem of the Savior Jesus.

BUT WHAT we want to touch upon now is those believers who come out and serve while they are going through those valleys, or fear and anxiety, anguish, mourning, or poor health. We want to share with all of you how much it means to the ministry and to the Lord that you choose to still come out and serve and minister to people despite the trials that you are going through.

One of our favorite verses is 2 Corinthians 1:3-4, which says, "Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord

Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies and God of all comfort, who comforts us in all our tribulation, that we may be able to comfort those who are in any trouble, with the comfort with which we ourselves are comforted by God."

JUST THIS past month we had a brother in the Lord, Pastor Eddie Matos, come out and share with the ministry his testimony of how the Lord cured him from leukemia and how the Lord was with him throughout that trial and his suffering.

The doctors were not optimistic when Eddie went to the hospital in December, but Eddie and his wife Lucy believed and trusted in the Lord and called out to Him and knew that our God was more than able, and he walked out of that hos-

God Speaks Through the City

Part 37: Psalm 30 By a servant in Christ

A troubled man struggles to heal

The Father's Heart ministry often encounters difficult situations that show how much the Lord is needed on this earth. I have prayed much about writing the story that follows given its tragic content. Still, as Hebrews 3:15 says, "Today, if you hear His voice, harden not your hearts."

Pastor Russ had just finished his

sermon on North Clinton Avenue when I noticed a man standing next to me weeping. I asked "Kenneth" if he would like prayer and he said, "Yes, I just walked over three miles to be here for food and for God...the list of things I need prayer for is endless..."

KENNETH MOVED away a bit from me a bit as if to gain composure, but proceeded to share his troubles.

"My three brothers died recently, two of them in the last three months. They either OD'd or were killed in drug-related deals. My dear brother was just shot in the head by a gang member right in front of me. The shooter then threatened me, 'This is what's going to happen to you if you don't cooperate...'

"My fourth brother is deathly ill and I'm the only one left to help my mom. She's my everything... A loving woman, an amputee in a wheelchair with cancer. She needs constant medical care, but her help is unreliable and a struggle. And, look at me... can't drive, been homeless and on drugs forever, WHAT GOOD AM I??" Kenneth broke out in tears.

AS I prayed with him, a loving brother saw what was going on and asked if he could join us. We emphasized to Kenneth that we cared for him but most importantly, how much Jesus loves him.

Things calmed down a bit as we walked him through the food line, providing encouragement and sharing what the ministry is about. Ken-

neth knew that we cared for him but most importantly, how much Jesus loves him.

THINGS CALMED down a bit as we walked him through the food line, providing encouragement and sharing what the ministry was about. Kenneth felt blessed by the experience and asked how he could participate given he did not drive.

My brother and I told him "If that is truly in your heart, there will be a way." Given how late it was, the long walk back to where he was being given shelter, and the fact we were in the center of "Heroin Alley" on Clinton Avenue, I offered to drive Kenneth back after we were done.

WHEN WE got to his housing shelter, Kenneth was hospitable and asked me up to his room to continue discussion. He shared his troubled past and how being in a coma for four months had negatively affected his life. I spent time sharing Jesus' love for him and how we all need Jesus as Savior.

Politely, Kenneth told me that the time was not "right." There seemed to be more to the story.

DURING THE next few weeks my brother and I drove Kenneth to a number of outreaches. It was difficult getting ahold of him since he did not have a phone and we needed to leave messages with security at the shelter.

Making things worse, in just a matter of two weeks, he was sent to the hospital twice, one time for depression and suicidal thoughts. My brother and I prayed and prayed for him to have a "Romans 10:9 moment":

"...IF YOU confess with your mouth Jesus as Lord, and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved."

The Lord also put in our hearts to

print Psalm 30, frame it, and give it to Kenneth for encouragement:

"O LORD, You brought my soul up from the grave; You have kept me alive, that I should not go down to the pit" (Psalm 30:3).

Kenneth was growing spiritually, and I invited him to join my brother and me at church. He looked down

saying, "You don't want me there. I have done bad things..."

WE ALL have, I explained. "If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us" (1 John 1:8).

Kenneth stayed quiet and eventually said, "You don't understand... I am a convicted murderer."

IT WAS then my turn to be quiet. During the awkward moment, Kenneth explained: "Years ago, someone broke into my mother's house to rob her. She fought back but the thief stabbed her many times. She was in critical condition but miraculously survived.

"When she came to, she told me I knew the thief and gave me his name. I did not call the police, took matters into my own hands, found the guy, and killed him. Did nine years in prison. See what I mean? Nobody is going to allow a murderer in church..."

WHEN KENNETH described himself as a murderer, a number of thoughts crossed my mind: Moses killed an Egyptian; David lusted for Bathsheba and assigned Uriah to a deadly battle so he would die; Paul approved Stephen's stoning and persecuted Christians. Proverbs 28 paints two pictures:

"He who covers his sins will not prosper, but whoever confesses and forsakes them will have mercy... A man burdened with bloodshed will flee into a pit; let no one help him" (Proverbs 28:13,17).

Will Kenneth forsake his sin, or will he flee into a pit? To be continued in the newsletter's May-June issue.
