Let's pray that God does mighty things

atthew 11:28 says, "Come to Me, all you who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest." Psalm 142:1-3 says, "I cry out to the Lord; I plead for the Lord's mercy. I pour out my complaints before Him and tell Him all my trou-

bles. When I am overwhelmed, you alone know the way I should turn."

Weekly, it seems lately, and even daily at The Father's Heart we hear pleas from the people of Rochester for help from above.

THE PEOPLE, some His children, some yet to come to the Lord; come to the ministry asking for prayer, asking for encouragement, seeking Godly advice, crying for comfort from the Lord, asking for a hug so they have that personal touch of hope from someone, or seeking a word from the Lord, a promise from His scriptures that it will be OK.

AT LEAST one outreach weekly we come into contact with those who have attempted suicide or are contemplating it, or know someone who has done the same. They come seeking comfort and prayer.

WE HAVE even had to call 911 in the past month because people have threatened to harm themselves. It breaks our heart that they or their loved ones feel like this.

WE HAVE had loved ones coming to the ministry and showing us a picture of their child, wondering if we have seen him because he has been missing for weeks. We have had pregnant women come to the bus in sandals, strung out on drugs.

We have had men come up drunk begging for help from their addiction. We have had families come up asking for an extra meal or for a winter jacket.

WE HAVE even had a child say, "If you guys weren't here I don't know how we would have ate, we have nothing at home."

It is because of these stories and these faces that this newsletter entry is a little different than normal. But this is what the Lord has given us.

IN PSALM 142:5-7 it says, "Then I pray to you, O Lord. I say, 'You are my place of refuge. You are all I really want in life. Hear my cry, for I am very low. Rescue me from my persecutors, for they are too strong for me. Bring me out of prison so I can thank you. The godly will crowd around me, for you are good to me.'"

We know we are in the busy time of the year, but we ask that for the next few months you would remember The Father's Heart in your prayers.

WE ASK that you would pray as we will pray for those on the streets struggling with fear, anxiety, depression, addiction, or suicidal thoughts, and those who are just feeling hopeless.

We ask that you would pray for those who don't have all that we have, who may not even have their next meal. For those who may have an empty seat at their table because of a loss of someone they love.

WE ASK that you would pray that the ministry would be looked at as a place of refuge. That the individuals in our city would know that we serve a God who hears them and loves them, and that they would cry out to Him for salvation and for the peace that surpasses all understanding.

May our focus also be that the Lord's voice and His word would be in their hearts and minds so much so that the enemy's voice would be drowned out. That the

I said that a gospel message was shared before the meal, she said she wasn't interested and grabbed the boy and left in a hurry

God Speaks Through the City

Part 35: Psalm 139:7-12 By a servant in Christ

God is around us, but does He dwell in us?

The second part of our story about "William" at a Chili Avenue outreach (see Part 1 in the September-October issue) involves suicide, the tenth-leading cause of death in the U.S. Studies have shown suicide to be on the rise, especially for middle-aged white men.

IN 2017 there were an estimated 1.4 million suicide attempts, with more than 47,000 Americans taking their lives. As a result of the troubling aspects of suicide, these numbers are believed to be understated.

That evening on Chili Avenue brought back sad memories of a close friend who took his life by stepping in front of a train a few blocks from my church. Unfortunately, my love, support, help getting him to treatments for depression, and time spent at a psychiatric unit reading to him from the Bible did not change the final outcome. Having lost other dear friends and relatives to suicide heightened my sensitivity to William's situation.

AFTER BEING ministered to by a brother and myself, William went to sit on a nearby front porch, dismissing our suggestions to come to the outreach. He appeared consumed by a serious discussion. When people started walking down the line

for free food and clothing, I walked over to where William was sitting.

SOME IN the group expressed concerns seeing a stranger approach, but William calmed them down and came toward me.

During a long discussion, William went deeper into his relational, financial, and addiction problems. The brother who made the initial connection periodically stopped by, urging him to join the outreach.

"WE ALL make bad choices," the brother said. "The message you chose not to hear dealt with issues you could have benefited from." The brother thought a "good cop, bad cop" approach could help. It felt like a team effort as William continued to weep and thank us for our caring.

AS I shared the gospel, William kept downplaying the value of his "religion." He was puzzled to hear that I agreed. I explained that his infant baptism and church attendance in his early years do not alone bring about a closer relationship with God. He cried out "I HAVE FAITH! I KNOW GOD EXISTS!" while showing me tattoos on his arms of crosses and praying hands. William then went on to share a story of God's presence.

"The other night I could not sleep so I went to someone's back yard to sit and think. After being there for hours, I noticed dawn started to break and dozens of birds were flying around in circles, like a dance. The beauty of it all blew my mind! GOD WAS ALL AROUND ME!"

I ASKED William if that beautiful manifestation of God's creation touched his heart and made him rethink about suicide. "No," he quickly answered, "it just made me realize how messed up I was." His comment opened the door to discuss salvation. Yes, God is all around us but if we open our hearts, He will dwell within us.

"DO YOU not know that you are the temple of God and that the Spirit of God dwells in you?" (1 Corinthians 3:16).

William became more comfortable and decided to walk with me to the outreach. I told him that Petra Christian Fellowship was nearby, and that Pastor Jeff and his wife Jamie were at the outreach. After an introduction, Pastor Jeff and Jamie prayed with William as he continued to weep. He was very thankful for the loving gesture and was provided information about Petra's location and service times.

ALTHOUGH WILLIAM said he would attend church that Sunday, he did not. We have not seen him since and continue to pray that he does not follow through with suicide. Instead, we pray that he allows the Spirit of God "all around him" to come within him. Yes, we cannot flee His presence, whether we are watching the wonderous flight of birds at dawn or engaging in the sins of this world. But He comes within us when we seek Him and repent of our sins.

PSALM 139:7-12: "Where can I go from Your Spirit, or where can I flee from Your presence? If I ascend into heaven, You are there; If I make my bed in hell, behold, You are there. If I take the wings of the morning, and dwell in the uttermost parts of the sea, even there Your hand shall lead me, and Your right hand shall hold me. If I say, 'Surely the darkness shall fall on me,' even the night shall be light about me; indeed, the darkness shall not hide from You, but the night shines as the day; the darkness and the light are both alike to You."
