

God Speaks Through the City

Part 33: Romans 8:9-11 By a servant in Christ

God was all around him, but not in him

t was a beautiful Friday evening serving the Lord along with Petra Christian Fellowship at Chili Avenue. Food tables were ready, and it was time to reach out to the neighborhood.

As I walked away from the outreach, I noticed one of the brothers had connected with a neighborhood couple who were listening attentively. I approached them as my brother began to share the gospel and what Jesus did for us at the cross.

THE LADY was responsive, saying "Amen" and "Thank you, Jesus." In contrast, the gentleman, "William," listened but his heart seemed heavy as he looked down with sorrow.

The brother shared with him four critical elements of salvation and asked William if he wished to surrender his life to Jesus. William was somewhat dismissive, stating that he already believed in God.

WILLIAM'S GIRLFRIEND expressed her gratitude for what we were doing and walked away. In God's perfect timing, her departure enhanced our focus on William as he became increasingly emotional. He told us how God came into his life as an infant being baptized at a church a few blocks away.

Throughout his early years he had

attended this church but eventually disconnected from it: "I would go there every Sunday to hear the priest read Bible verses and repeat prayers. As I got older, they became just words. My life was going in a difficult direction and I could not relate to what I heard there." His comment opened yet another door of our ministry to him.

My brother and I shared that without having a personal relationship directly with Jesus our lives would be empty. Suddenly, William started waving his arms in circles, saying in a loud voice: "I BELIEVE IN GOD! HE IS ALL AROUND ME!!"

WE WERE taken by surprise by his comment and the body language. I hugged William tighter saying: "Yes, God is all around us and has been there since the beginning of time. But, is He within you?" I placed my hand on William's heart as he continued to weep.

cross to save you. If the Holy Spirit is within you, why would He ever want you to commit suicide?"

MY BROTHER and I asked William to come with us to hear Pastor Russ' message. We told him that the message, unlike the repetitive readings he may have heard at his church, would touch him. We shared Pastor Russ' testimony, how he had been lost just like him and had gained eternal life through Jesus.

"It was right that we should make merry and be glad, for your brother was dead and is alive again, and was lost and is found" (Luke 15:32).

WILLIAM WAS appreciative but declined to listen to the Word and walked away. Later, as my brother and I heard the message, we shook our heads since it was a perfect fit to what William needed to hear. Not a coincidence by any means.

Yes, our sovereign God is merciful, but it is our responsibility to follow Him. William knew that God was

"all around" him but had not opened his heart to allow His Spirit to dwell within.

"But you are not in the flesh but in the Spirit, if indeed the Spirit of God dwells in you. Now if anyone does not have the Spirit of Christ, he is not His. And if Christ is in you, the body is dead because of sin, but the Spirit is life because of righteousness. But if the Spirit of Him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, He who raised Christ from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies through His Spirit who dwells in you" (Romans 8:9-11).

WILLIAM'S STORY does not end here. He went to sit on the porch of a house within hearing distance of our speakers. The second part of his story, to be published in the November-December issue of the newsletter, will cover our continued prayers and efforts to share the love and intimacy of Jesus with this troubled man.
