God Speaks Through the City

Part 6: Ephesians 2:4-5 By a servant in Christ

If the Lord is with us, whom shall we fear?

he Father's Heart ministry has witnessed many lifechanging events as the lost are embraced by the caring arms of our Savior. But we know that the enemy walks about as a roaring lion, seeking whom he may devour (1 Peter 5:8). Recently the enemy tried to derail the ministry with a "child of disobedience," whom we will call Reggie.

Hudson Avenue is a challenging location. Although churches abound and joyful gospel music can be heard outside their doors, it is hard to sugarcoat what happens in the streets. Drugs, contention and chaos are rampant.

MEETING REGGIE was memorable. He approached me with an angry grimace saying: "Do you know who I am? I am the neighborhood thug. I have stolen. I have beat up people. I am already 65 percent of my way to hell!" I said: "Reggie, based on what I heard you may actually be 66 percent of the way to hell. But hey, it's not too late if you repent of your sins and choose to follow Jesus as Lord and Savior!" Reggie laughed and put his arm around me. Maybe I had

planted a seed. Or maybe not.

A MONTH later we were back at Hudson and Reggie dropped in. He was drunk, smoking pot, and being disruptive. Some servants tried to calm him but Reggie continued to be disruptive while the Word was being preached. Suddenly, a forceful voice was heard: "Be respectful of these people who are showing their love for us! Most of all, show respect for God!" I turned and saw an elderly man wearing rags and holding a cane. Reggie countered with familiar threats. But the elderly man stated with conviction, "I do not fear a man like you. I fear God and since He is with me, who can be against me?" Romans 8:31 was spoken without hesitation so I knew this man was a child of God.

Reggie left and the crowd calmed down. I approached the elderly man, whom we will call Terrence. Clearly he was a man living alone and in poverty but blessed by having Jesus in his life. Terrence was an artist. He created his art using scraps of metal, wood and cloth. He said it was a gift from God he was thankful for.

AFTER RECEIVING a warm hug from Terrence, he walked away telling me he would be back. I then took a walk to visit a halfway house for drug addicts a couple of blocks away. Upon my return, one of the servants called me saying: "A man named Terrence wanted to give you a gift. Here." I was amazed. It was a beautiful miniature rocking chair

made of fine twigs. The slightly irregular pattern of the weave revealed it was crafted by hand with great care. Since Terrence thought I had gone home, he told the other servant that he could give it to his wife.

GIVEN THE circumstances, I insisted my friend's wife should receive this wonderful gift. "Do you see a man who excels in his work? He will stand before kings; He will not stand before obscure men." (Proverbs 22:29).

Through Terrence, God spoke: "Do not be frightened in any way by those who oppose you. This is a sign to them that they will be destroyed, but that you will be saved — and that by God." (Philippians 1:28).

FOR REGGIE, I pray with hope. "But because of his great love for us, God, who is rich in mercy, made us alive with Christ even when we were dead in transgressions — it is by grace you have been saved!" (Ephesians 2:4-5).
