THROUGHOUT THE summer we had our Kids Club in the park next to Edgerton Community Center and it was such a blessing.

We had Erin C. with Open Air Campaigners and Julio P. with Wakem-Up Ministry do great Bible teachings and activities with the kids and each week the ministry was able to bless the kids with ice cream.

The Lord provided backpacks with school supplies so at our final club on August 20 we gave out more than 35 backpacks, along with an ice cream sundae with all the toppings. The kids loved it!

IT WAS such a blessing to see the kids smile when they got the big sundaes, and for us to share that Jesus loves them.

PLEASE PRAY for these kids as many of them come from broken families. One mom came up to us that day and thanked us for blessing her kids because they are homeless and living out of their car, and she stated it meant so much to them.

In Matthew 5:16 Jesus says, "Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven." We pray that throughout the summer this program glorified God and pointed them to Jesus.

WE ALSO started The Soup and The Savior Shed Wednesdays through Fridays from 9:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. On those days many have come up one by one and received a meal, snacks, clothing and above all prayer.

Lost to addiction, but not unloved

Ecclesiastes 3:1,4 says, "To everything there is a season, A time for every purpose under heaven: ... A time to weep, And a time to laugh; A time to mourn, And a time to dance."


REDEEMING LOVE has had those times — times of rejoicing and weeping — these past few months. We unfortunately lost at least two women, maybe more, to addiction.

We went their funeral or their candlelight vigils and shared with their families how their family member loved them and how, when we asked them if they wanted prayer, they always would ask for prayer for their families.

IT BREAKS my heart to think about the lives lost to addiction, of the mothers or fathers, siblings, or kids who weep for the life lost, and who question "What if?" or "If only."

We pray that through the ministry

One wrong choice can mess up a whole generation of a family. Please pray for these two beautiful people who God loves so much. I have had many talks with them about the Lord!"



we offered them a little comfort by showing up and telling them that they really were loved by their loved ones and that people were praying for them.

JESUS IS near to the brokenhearted and the crushed in spirit. God is sustaining us through these losses and our prayer is that they called out to Jesus, and they are no longer suffering but rejoicing in the presence of their Savior, Jesus.

We also had many times of rejoicing the past few months. One of the women who has been off the streets and sober for more than two years is expecting a child in October!!! Redeeming Love, with a few others, put on a baby shower and it was so awesome to stand back and see what the Lord has done and is doing; that a new life will soon be here.

ANOTHER GIRL who is doing well and has been sober for more than two years is now working. Two women who are off the streets got baptized and others are in rehab and transitional housing, and are clean and sober.

One girl who has been sober for 11 months told me just the other day

that, "You women in the van inspired me to go into treatment; you made me feel that I could do it."

All I can say is, "Thank you, Jesus!!!! Praise You, Jesus!!!!" He is making beauty from ashes; He is restoring.

BE ENCOURAGED, saints. He has the victory and we have only just begun to see the miracles that He is going to do in these women. He will not give up on them, and Jesus in us won't give up on them either.

The story that follows involves a very troubled lady who attended our outreach seeking food, compassion, and the comfort that only God can provide. "Fear not, for I am with you; Be not dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you, yes, I will help you, I will uphold you with My righteous right hand" (Isaiah 41:10).

AS THE line for groceries was coming to an end, I noticed a lady with her hand on her face weeping and shaking. As she approached me, I offered her bread, bagels, and pastries but she could barely talk as she cried while holding her bag with groceries.

I tried to connect with "Emily," offering prayer, and she nodded her head saying "Yes" while her crying intensified. I walked around the table, having another servant take over the bread section, and asked Emily how I could pray for her.

she responded, "Everything in my life is a mess ... see those buildings on the corner? I am homeless and sleep between two of them ..." As I started to pray, she stopped me saying "... wait, there is more ..."

While weeping, she shared with anxiety other troubles in addition to her homelessness. Her testimony was so compelling that it touched

my heart, and I also began to weep as I prayed for her.

EMILY WAS touched with the prayer and after accepting Jesus in her heart, she approached me, giving me a hug. "Thank you for the prayer, thank you for listening, and for the food. You guys are a blessing to me, strengthening my faith and feeding me with food and Jesus. Bless you."

WE CONTINUED our discussion as she headed to the truck for a meal Continued on Page 5

while expressing her appreciation for The Father's Heart. I told her I would be praying for her, gave her an outreach schedule, and attempted to connect her with ladies in the ministry.

AFTER EMILY received her meal, she continued to thank servants in the ministry including sister Anne, who was handing out meals.

Although Emily's homelessness and situation are common with people we encounter, her weeping and openness explaining her trials motivated relevant prayer addressing her hardships. As I reflected on what had happened, I wondered if my own weeping affected my ability to minister and pray for her.

IN RETROSPECT, it seemed that my connection with Emily was enhanced when she noticed my weeping for her as explained by Romans 12:15-16: "Rejoice with those who rejoice, and weep with those who weep. Be of the same mind toward one another. Do not set your mind on high things, but associate with the humble. Do not be wise in your own opinion."

EMILY'S EXPERIENCE reveals how critical it is for The Father's Heart to be out in the streets, not only providing food and the gospel, but also encouragement and prayer. If I had met Emily at a church, she would not have been able to point to the specific location where she sleeps or describe other difficult issues associated with her life in the neighborhood.

I continue to pray for Emily and her troubles, hoping as Psalm 126:5 states: "Those who sow in tears Shall reap in joy." Our Lord hears our cries and saves those who call upon Him.

PSALM 145:14-19: "The Lord upholds all who fall, And raises up all who are bowed down. The eyes of all look expectantly to You, and You give them their food in due season. You open Your hand and satisfy the desire of every living thing. The Lord is righteous in all His ways, Gracious in all His works. The Lord is near to all who call upon Him, To all who call upon Him in truth. He will fulfill the desire of those who fear Him; He also will hear their cry and save them."
