are Christians so judgmental of others? As Christians we must follow the word of God and not condone sinful behavior, while showing grace toward others as we look in the mirror; "for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God" (Romans 3:23).

THE STORY that follows describes an interaction with a critical young man at North Clinton and Oakman who came to the outreach to condemn our sharing of the gospel of lesus Christ.

Shortly after food and clothing were placed on tables, I walked across Clinton Avenue and started reaching out to people. When I approached a young man, "Bo," inviting him to join the ministry to hear the word of God and be blessed with a meal and groceries, he stopped dead in his tracks, looked at me face to face, and inquired, "YOU ARE A CHRISTIAN??"

WHEN I answered that, "Yes, I am a Christian," he seemed indignant, telling me: "How can you consider

to give away food and 'love'? ALL YOU GUYS DO IS CONDEMN OTHERS!"

As I tried to explain that The Father's Heart ministry wishes to share not only food and clothing but the love of Jesus with those in need, he continued to rebuke me, expressing his negative views of Christians. Given Bo's animosity towards me and Christians, I told him that Jesus loves him and started walking away.

HE THEN grabbed me by the shoulder while saying: "Tell you what ... I am going to cross the street and check you guys out. I'm sure that I won't be surprised."

As we crossed the street, Pastor Russ was beginning to preach the message, which put a sarcastic smile on Bo. He said, "This will be interesting. Tell you what ... I am going to record his 'speech' and post it online to share your Christian condemnation with others. Are you going to stop me?"

I TOLD him to go ahead, saying that what he hears may surprise him and others he shares the video



with. Bo smiled sarcastically and began to record a video of Pastor Russ' powerful message.


Bo became quiet as he listened and recorded the message. He seemed dumbfounded as Pastor Russ shared how Jesus loves us and gave His life on the cross to forgive our sins. The message included a testimony of Pastor Russ as a former drug addict and how Jesus set him free of his drug addiction.

what he thought, and he responded: "Must admit... I'm surprised..." I shared John 3:17, "For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world through Him might be saved" and suggested that he get in line for groceries and a meal.

BO THOUGHT about it, while watching people being given groceries saying: "Let me think about it ..." After a few minutes he turned down the offer, saying: "I'm going to go to the grocery store at the corner and get some cigarettes since I ran out. Maybe I'll come back." I told him that I hoped he would return and enjoy fellowship, a meal, and prayer if he was so inclined.

As he started walking to the grocery store, he stopped, turned around saying: "Oh, now I know what's going to happen ... you are going to judge me for smoking and leaving your event. Right?"

I MEDITATED on a response and said: "You heard Pastor Russ explain how he was a drug addict before he came to Jesus. I would never judge him. He is a dear brother in the Lord."

Bo looked at me in the eye, waved goodbye, and left the outreach in a more placid mood than when he came.

DEALING WITH Bo was not easy. I hope and pray that his experience at The Father's Heart ministry touched his heart and changed his view of Christians from being judgmental, to being reflective of the love of Jesus.

Luke 6:37-38: "Judge not, and you shall not be judged. Condemn not, and you shall not be condemned. Forgive, and you will be forgiven. Give, and it will be given to you: good measure, pressed down, shaken together, and running over will be put into your bosom. For with the same measure that you use, it will be measured back to you."
