We asked a boy who was probably about 10 years old if he wanted a Bible. He looked and said yes with the biggest smile on his face. When he was handed the Bible he quickly turned around to his sister, and with a big smile he held up the Bible and exuberantly said, "Look! I have a Bible! They gave me a Bible!"

HIS EXCITEMENT reminded us of what pure, innocent joy in the Lord is. Does that boy understand all about the Bible? No, but when asked what and who the Bible spoke about, he said in a questioning tone, "Jesus?" We said yes and he stated he was going to go home and read it. He was just so excited to do so.

At a Lake Avenue outreach recently there was a woman who came with three of her nine children. When they approached you could tell by their tattered and stained clothes that they were in need of many things.

God Speaks Through the City

Part 27 Samuel 2:7-8 By a servant in Christ

Money can corrupt us or help us honor God

hile terrified with fear of the Lord, Job referred to the Almighty as being "...unique, and who can make Him change?" This story describes how a changeable earthly article, the dollar, can be used in two opposite ways.

Although 1 Timothy 6:10 teaches that "the love of money is a root of all kinds of evil," we are also guided to give tithes, gifts to the needy, and to "Honor the Lord with your possessions, and with the firstfruits of all your increase; so your barns will be filled with plenty, and your vats will overflow with new wine" (Proverbs 3:9-10).

UNFORTUNATELY, THE dollar often becomes an idol, is coveted, or used to satisfy our flesh.

The common expression, "the almighty dollar" is a clear example of idolatry. Are we honoring or dishonoring the Lord with the dollar? In the story that follows God spoke through one of the poorest neighborhoods we minister to shed His light on this question.

TURNOUT WAS on the light side for this location and servants were walking around the neighborhood inviting people to the outreach. Across the street I noticed a lady with a little boy by a grocery store.

boy, "Dion," beat me to the punch. He quickly stretched out his hand holding a dollar bill saying, "Take this dollar. You need it..." I chuckled considering my dress code, not always the best. "Thank you so much!" I replied. "But I want you to keep that dollar. Your mom can help you use it!"

DION WAS persistent. His arm stretched out harder as he insisted, "No, no, you take it. You need it a lot more than I do!" What a blessing this was!

I spoke with the mother and she told me that little Dion had "the heart of Jesus" in him. Wonders never cease with the Lord! I signaled with my hands "stay put" and ran across the street to find a kiddie tract, candy, one of our Ten Commandments silver coins to give the little angel. I rummaged, picked up a couple of things, ran back, but they were gone.

DISAPPOINTED, I noticed an elderly man, "Chuck," sitting right across the street absorbing the message Pastor Russ was preaching. After the message was done, Chuck shared how he loved the Lord and

how he was blessed by his family's involvement with their church.

I INVITED him to cross the street, but Chuck said he would rather have others with greater need get the groceries and hot meal. We said goodbye, and as I started to head back a young lady stopped me saying, "Excuse me... could you help me stand my bike up?" Sure, I said, although it was not clear why she needed my help.

After I propped her bike up and put on the bike stand, she thanked me and walked across the street. "Alicia" looked very young, healthy, and in good shape. Why did she ask me for help? No clue at the time. I walked back to bless people with free food and groceries.

THE LINE dwindled and I left my position behind a table. Alicia then came over softly saying, "Can I talk with you?" She proceeded to warn me that the man I had talked to across the street had come on to her to engage in vulgar activities. I was surprised, Chuck seemed like a nice man, but one never knows. Alicia started to point out neighborhood people, calling them "stalkers." "They come for me to get what they want." Abruptly, she changed the topic and asked, "Can you give me a dollar?" My first silly thought was that I should have taken Dion's dollar.

I responded that we were not supposed to give away money, but that I would love to share something having much greater value, the gospel. Alicia softened her voice, approached me a little too close, saying she really wanted more money — at least five dollars. I tried to put an end to the conversation telling her that Jesus loved her and would provide for her needs.

IN RESPONSE, Alicia became hostile, shouting, "I have read your

Bible and ain't gonna read it again!! By the way, Jesus was the son of Joseph, not the son of God!! I went to church as a little girl and got -----(detailed description of sexual abuse) by the church bishop!! Is that the man of God you are???"

"A SOFT answer turns away wrath, but a harsh word stirs up anger" (Proverbs 15:1) is necessary but not always easy.

Was Alicia telling the truth about Chuck? The "stalkers"? Her church bishop? Too many inconsistencies and motives at play here. Truths or not, Alicia is in great need of prayer.

ONE THING I was sure about. A dollar offering by a six-year-old to honor the Almighty lifts up, while a desire for the "almighty dollar" brings low. As Hannah prayed in Samuel, all our riches are given to us by His grace and serve His purpose, not ours.

1 Samuel 2:7-8: "The Lord makes poor and makes rich; He brings low and lifts up. He raises the poor from the dust and lifts the beggar from the ash heap, to set them among princes and make them inherit the throne of glory."
